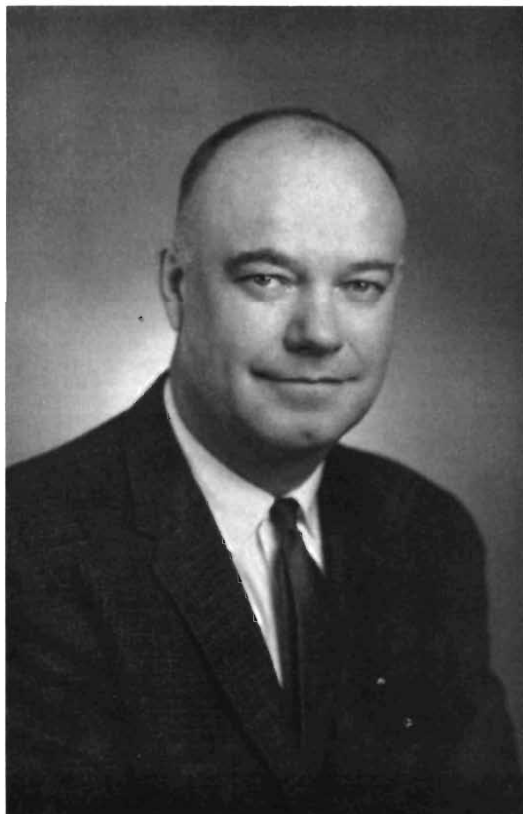

**Dr. Alfred G. Karlson**

Dr. Alfred G. Karlson, ISC '35, is a consultant in the Section of Microbiology, Mayo Clinic and Associate Professor of Comparative Pathology, Mayo Foundation, Graduate School, University of Minnesota.

Dr. Karlson was born April 26, 1910, at Virginia, Minnesota. He was graduated from Waconia High School, Waconia, Minnesota in 1928, and he then entered the University of Minnesota where he enrolled in pre-veterinary courses. In 1931 Dr. Karlson transferred to Iowa State College (now Iowa State University) at Ames, Iowa where he entered the Division of Industrial

Science and the Division of Veterinary Medicine; he obtained the degrees of Bachelor of Science in 1934 and Doctor of Veterinary Medicine in 1935. Dr. Karlson then entered the graduate school, Iowa State College, and received the degree of Master of Science in 1938. In 1938 he was awarded a Fellowship in Experimental Medicine in the Mayo Foundation, Rochester, Minnesota, and in 1942 he received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Pathology from the University of Minnesota.

While in college Dr. Karlson was a member of Cardinal Guild and the Veishea Central Committee, serving as treasurer of both groups. He was also a member of the Inter-fraternity Council. Dr. Karlson was elected to Phi Kappa Phi and Phi Zeta scholastic honorary societies and to the honor society, Cardinal Key. He is a member of Sigma Xi.

From September 1935 to June 1938, Dr. Karlson was an Instructor in the Department of Veterinary Hygiene, Iowa State College. He was a fellow in The Mayo Foundation from July 1938 to June 1939 and an Instructor in Veterinary Research, University of Minnesota from June 1939 to November 1941. From November, 1941, to October, 1945, Dr. Karlson served with the Second Medical Laboratory, United States Army, in the North African and Italian campaigns. He was released to civilian life in 1945 with the grade of lieutenant colonel in the Veterinary Corps.

Dr. Karlson returned to Rochester, Minnesota, on January 1, 1946, as a consultant in the Mayo Foundation Institute of Experimental Medicine, and on October 1, 1952, he became a consultant in the Section of Pathologic Anatomy of the Mayo Clinic. He became a consultant in the Section of Microbiology of the Mayo Clinic on July 1, 1953, a post he has continued

to occupy. Dr. Karlson was appointed an instructor in comparative pathology in the Mayo Foundation, Graduate School, University of Minnesota, in 1946, and was advanced to assistant professor in 1951 and to associate professor in 1956.

Dr. Karlson has maintained a special interest in the microbiologic aspects of disease, particularly tuberculosis. He is the author or co-author of more than 100 contributions to the literature in tuberculosis and other fields of laboratory medicine. Since 1940 Dr. Karlson has served as a section editor of *Biological Abstracts*. He has been secretary of the Conference of Research Workers in Animal Diseases since 1948, and he is a member of the editorial board of the *American Journal of Veterinary Research*. Dr. Karlson was President of the American College of Veterinary Pathologists from 1948 to 1950 and he served on the Editorial Board of the *Journal of Bacteriology* from 1950 to 1954. He has been a member of the Research Council of the American Veterinary Medical Association and is now a member of the National Board of Veterinary Examiners.

Dr. Karlson was president of the Olmstead County Tuberculosis and Health Association in 1959 and 1960, and currently is a member of the board of directors of the Minnesota Tuberculosis and Health Association, and chairman of the committee on research of that organization. In 1962 he was elected to the board of directors of the National Tuberculosis Association; he is an ex-officio member of the Committee on Pulmonary Diseases, Minnesota State Medical Association.

Dr. Karlson was certified as a specialist in microbiology in 1961 by the American Board of Microbiology. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Microbiology and a member of the American Veterinary Medical Association, the Society of American Bacteriologists, the American College of Veterinary Pathologists, the National Tuberculosis Association, the Minnesota State Veterinary Medical Association, the Conference of Research Workers in Animal Diseases, the Society for Experimental Biology and Medicine, and the

American Association of Pathologists and Bacteriologists.

Dr. Karlson was married to Miss Janice R. Stillians (Home Ec '35, I.S.C.) of Villisca, Iowa, on June 24, 1938. Dr. and Mrs. Karlson have five children: Alfred Lenart, 21, Karl John, 19, a student at Iowa State University, Kathy Jean, 15, Trudy Ann, 12, and Julie Kay, 8.

Dr. McClelland attended the University of Illinois and graduated from the College of Veterinary Medicine at I. S. U. in 1942. Du Pont of Newark, Delaware, the owner of one of the largest racing stables in the world.

Dr. McClelland, while associated with the Aledo Veterinary Clinic, pioneered and initiated nutritional therapeutics on a

practical professional basis, linking nutrition and veterinary medicine in an overall health program.
