HOLST TRACT

This year with the reorganization of a new Holst Tract Committee many improvements have been proposed and acted upon.

Projects completed this fall are:

1. Cleaning and reorganization of the files.
2. Orientation of freshman to the Holst Tract and its purposes.
3. Destructive pruning of the plantations to prevent christmas tree cutting.

Proposed projects for winter and spring quarter are:

1. Finish a new parking area.
2. Provide a contest area.
3. To select a site and assist in the building of a new shelter of which plans have been drawn and approved by the state.

The following are long range projects;

1. The study of growth adaptation of different species of conifers in Iowa.
2. The study of hardwood reproduction.

We feel that with shorter projects more may be realized in the activities of the Holst Tract because some of the projects maybe finished in a short enough time to realize there value.
