Dr. David is here to study newer methods of teaching and to secure materials to rebuild their university. 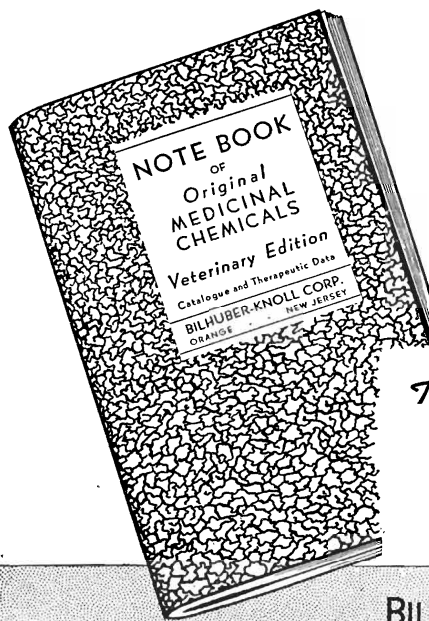
pus for 6 weeks before moving on to Kansas State College.

The School of Veterinary Science was begun in Manilla in 1910 as a result of an outbreak of an infectious disease in the caribou, a native type of cattle. Their first class was graduated in 1914. The curriculum is of 5 years duration but carries no pre-veterinary requirement. The curriculum is based on that offered in schools in the United States.
