

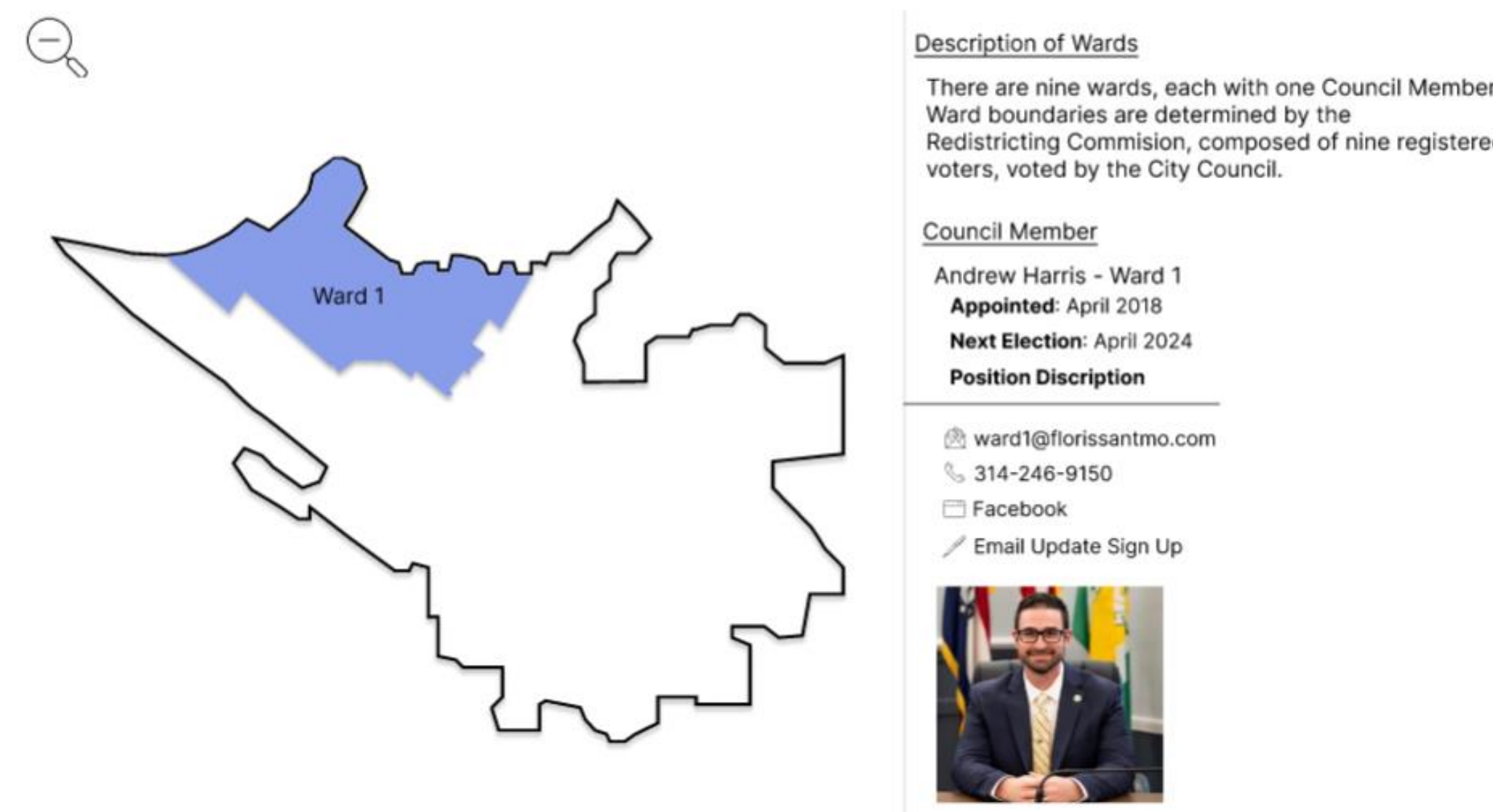
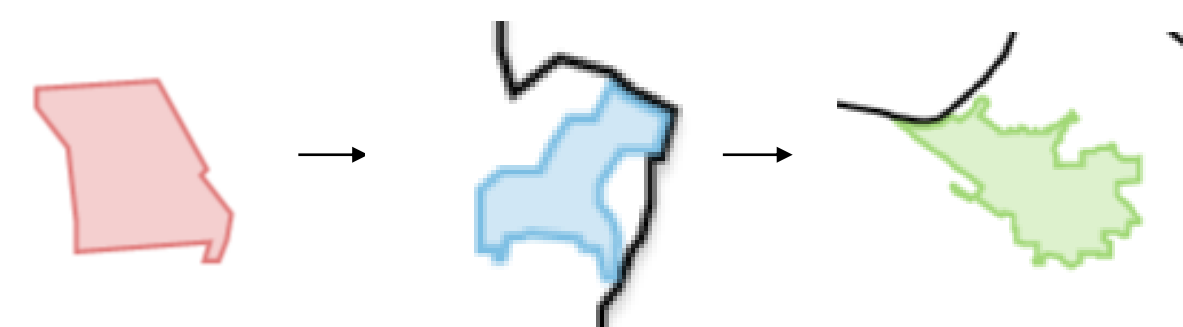

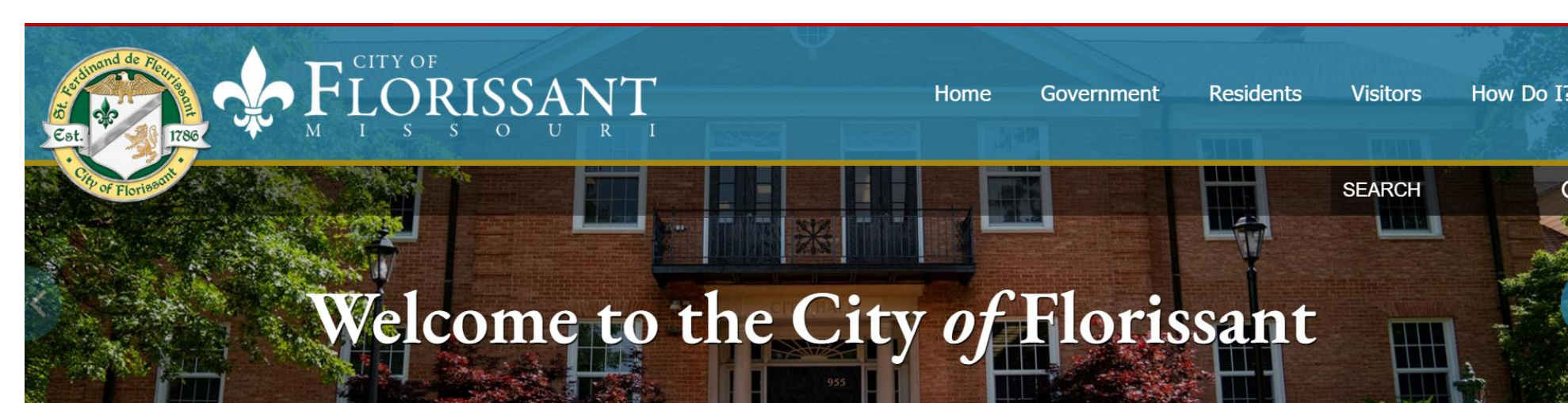
What is *Transparency.org*
